

Membership Types and Classes of Membership

A.Membership Types

- 1) There are two types of membership: Ordinary Member and Instructor Member
- 2) Membership types are to aid public understanding. Instructors who have been members for 10 consecutive years are considered as "Senior". There are no grades other than Senior.
- 3) **Ordinary** members and **Instructor** members <u>continue</u> to be able to apply to be assessed by the Technical Panel (TP).
 - a) Assessment is compulsory for Instructors but Ordinary Members can apply to be assessed.
 - b) Both will be assessed on their practice
 - c) Additionally, Instructors will be assessed on their teaching ability.
- 4) To be assessed by the TP a person must have been practising for at least 5 consecutive years.

Members can still teach even if they have less than 5 <u>consecutive</u> years' experience. They will simply be an **Ordinary** member rather than recognised as an **Instructor** by the TCUGB.

B. Classes of Membership

The Articles of Association define 3 Classes of Membership

- Full members can vote and stand for the Board
- Voting members can only vote (and NOT stand for the Board)
- Associate members can neither vote nor stand for the Board

For members who live in the United Kingdom, Channel Islands or Northern Ireland, the following framework shows how "Class" and "Membership Type" are determined based on TP decisions and number of <u>continuous and consecutive</u> years someone is a member as shown below.

Passed TP Assessment (*)	Membership Length	
	Less than 3 <u>continuous and</u> <u>consecutive</u> years	3 or more <u>continuous and consecutive</u> years
No	Class of Membership: Associate Membership Type: Ordinary	
Yes	Class of Membership: Voting Membership Type: Ordinary or Instructor	Class of Membership: Full Membership Type: Ordinary or Instructor

<u>Members who live outside the United Kingdom, Channel Islands or Northern Ireland</u> can be Instructor Members but will be assigned to the Associate Class of membership regardless of length of membership or whether they pass an assessment by the Technical Panel.

(*) – It is only possible to apply for Technical Panel assessment once a person has been practising their chosen Internal Art for 5 or more consecutive and continuous years. All Instructor Members are deemed to have passed a Technical Panel assessment.
